



High Kings' regal return to INEC

HAVING excited music fans on their inaugural sell-out Irish tour, The High Kings return to the INEC, Killarney this November.

The High Kings, featuring Finbarr Clancy, Brian Dunphy, Martin Furey and Darren Holden, are hailed as the most exciting Irish ballad group to emerge since The Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem electrified the worldwide folk revival of the 1960s.

Carrying on the tradition of great Irish music, The High Kings' first Irish tour was greeted by sell out audiences and standing ovations.

The highly acclaimed musical Director David

Downes, (musical director of Celtic Woman) has brought intricate harmonies and driving rhythms to The High Kings songbook, giving them a freshness and sparkle that is modern and exciting, without ever sacrificing the traditional melodies and lyrics, which made them so attractive in the first instance. The songs themselves reflect a wide range of moods, the rousing Rocky Road To Dublin, the haunting strains of The Parting Glass, the irresistible The Wild Rover and the stunning Fields of Glory.

The four-part vocal harmonies will be once again

backed by a band which includes world-class musicians; Martin O'Connor on accordion, Nollaig Casey on fiddle, Dave Keery on guitar, Paul Moore on double bass, Ewan Cowley on guitars and master percussionist Robbie Harris.

Incorporating some of the classic ballad repertoire from the past with new and exciting modern songs in the folk idiom, The High Kings are not to be missed.
